What is a Temporary Tent

In the Ontario Building Code, "tent" refers to a temporary fabric shelter used at open-air events, typically supported by poles and ground ties. Permanent fabric structures on buildings have separate requirements and are not covered in this guide.

Do I need a Permit for a Tent?

Under Ontario Building Code, tents or groups of tents require a permit when:

- •The total combined ground area of all tents exceeds 60m² (645ft²).
- •The tent is attached to a building.
- •The tent is located less than 3 meters (9ft-10ft) from other structures.

- 1. Any tent with sidewalls must be designed by a qualified and registered designer (BCIN).
- 2. A tent <225m2 in area and will no sidewalls or bleachers is exempt from any designer requirements of the Ontario Building Code.
- 3. No cooking that produces grease/oily vapors is allowed in tents without an approved ventilation system.
